
Luis García Montero, Director, Instituto Cervantes

As a poet, narrator and essayist he has received, among others, Premio Nacional de Literatura (1994), Premio Nacional de la Crítica (2003), Premio del Gremio de Libreros de Madrid (2009), Premio Poetas del Mundo Latino (México, 2010), Premio Ramón López Velarde (México, 2017) y Premio Paralelo 0 (Ecuador, 2018).

He is also an honorary professor at the University of Mar del Plata (Argentina) and in 2017 he was named Favorite Son of Andalusia.*



Francisco Moreno




Director of the Global Observatory for the Spanish Language

He is Full Member of the North American Academy of the Spanish Language (since 2017) and of the Academia Europaea (since 2022), and Corresponding Member of the Cuban Academy of the Language (since 2013), the Spanish Royal Academy (since 2015), the Chilean Academy of the Language (since 2017), and the Mexican Academy of Language (since 2018).


